Women in Philanthropy: “Funding Norm doesn’t Fund Norma!” New Mexico author and consultant **Mary Ellen Capek** will help us examine all the ways differences are locked into how we see people and how organizational culture operates and is essential for effective philanthropy.

Mary Ellen and co-author, Molly Mead, have just published their most recent book entitled *Effective Philanthropy* (MIT Press, March 2006). The book offers new ways of talking about diversity in organizations and linking success and effectiveness with an organization’s ability to institutionalize “deep diversity” and gender equality.

Mary Ellen will bring new ways of looking at gender and diversity to help us all think differently about how we do our work in order to use “all of the differences that divide us” to teach our organizations to become more effective. In achieving equitable funding, the goal is a more vibrant society in which everyone’s diverse contributions are recognized, appreciated, utilized, and funded!

Mary Ellen Capek is a founding officer and former executive director of the National Council for Research on Women. She is a founding board member of the Aspen Institute’s Nonprofit Sector Research Fund, a former member of Independent Sector’s Research Committee and The Conference Board’s Work/Life Leadership Council (formerly Work/Family Council), a founding member of Women & Philanthropy’s Action/Research Committee, and board chair of the Equality New Mexico Foundation. She currently works as a consultant to both foundations and nonprofit organizations, delivers speeches and workshops on deep diversity and effective philanthropy, and is a research scholar affiliated with the Anderson School of Management at the University of New Mexico.

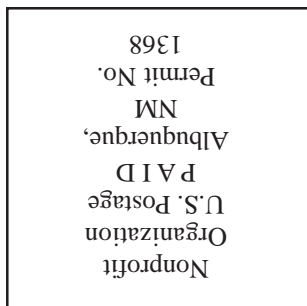
